

Many Will Say

“Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord,
have we not prophesied in thy name?
and in thy name have cast out devils?
and in thy name done many wonderful works?”

Matthew 7:22

“And then will I profess unto them,
I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.”

Matthew 7:23

Why?

Clearly, these people know what they have or have not done.

They are recounting to Christ the miracles that were done;
the prophetic utterances, casting out of devils and wonderful works.

These things are all facts of their lives and well within the scope of truth.

These are people who honestly think they have done all these things in his name.

Christ does not deny the truth of what they have done.

Christ does not declare them liars.

Christ does not refute their claims.

Christ simply tells them “I never knew you.” and then instructs them where to go and who they truly are as being,

“ye that work iniquity”.

What is it then that makes these prophets, these workers of wonderful works and deliverers of the demon possessed,
to be workers of iniquity in his eyes?

How can he say that he never knew them?

Very Simply . . . Because He Never Knew Them.

Christ is not a liar.

If he says he never knew someone, then he never knew them.

They may think that they know him.

The truth is that he does not know them and has never known them.

Are you prepared to hear these words from him?

“I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.”

What is it you think you have done in his name?

Have you done greater things than these; that the workers of iniquity have done?

Certainly, these workers must have known Christ?

How could they have done what they did unless they knew Christ?

The Truth

There is something that this last generation is called to do that no other generation has been called to do.

We are brothers and sisters of Christ who do the will of his father.

So says Christ, in Matthew 12:50

“For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother.”

Is it not the will of the father that we do works in the name of Jesus?

Of course, it is His will that we do these works in the name of Jesus.

The problem is that Jesus is not the name of Jesus.

Those who came before us were not accountable to this truth.

This truth was not revealed to them.

We however have the truth and have had access to it for over three- and one-half years.

This truth could have been seen by any one of us.

It's written in the word of God and as such read and reread over and over and over.

The problem here is just that it is read over.

Just a casual read, and it slips past unnoticed.

Three times the word declares the problem.

have we not prophesied in *thy name*?

and in *thy name* have cast out devils?

and in *thy name* done many wonderful works?"

They seem intent on being heard as those who work in *his name*.

Clearly this is the point of contention.

To make clear the point one might add to Christ's words this simple question,

"My Name?"

Then finish with his actual words of . . .

"I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity."

This shows the point more openly.

That point being whether these *iniquitous ones* knew his name.

They seem to think that they do.

He informs them that they do not.

They insist that what was done was in *his name*.

He tells them *he never knew* them.

They have never known him if he has never known them.

So, *the name* they *think* is his is in fact not his because they don't know him and never had known him.

It is their *ignorance of his name* that has them where they are in his eyes as workers of iniquity.

These will be the words of The Laodicean Church just before he spews them from his mouth.

"Did we not do these things in thy name?"

Do you know "The Name of Jesus"? or Do you know the name of "Jesus"?

Wee you baptized in "The Name of The Father"? or Were you baptized in the name of "The Father"?

The Family of God in Heaven and Earth all share His Name as written in Ephesians 3:14-15

Do you even know your own name?

The information is in the pages of the book that is life to his children.

Do you love God enough to admit that you don't know *His Name* and then turn from your ignorance to truth?

On that day many will say to him . . .

And He will say to them . . .

"I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity."
